### THIS WEEK

The March 8, 2021 club meeting was called to order by Kent Jester. Hanna Muirhead led the group in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

### GUEST SPEAKER

Lisa Carson, Executive Director of the Lawton Public School Foundation spoke to the club. She joined the LPSF in 2016 after a 32 year career a Lawton Public Schools. Lisa started as a teacher, then a counselor and then an administrator. She said whether you work as a teacher or a principal the job must be a passion. As a principal Lisa tried to do the best job possible with finances. But there is a gap between what a school district can provide and what a teacher needs.

Very often teachers have to pay for classroom items themselves or try to find external sources of funding for bigger ticket items. The mission of LPSF is to bridge the funding gap with grants sent direct to teachers rather than a district administration. The grants can be anything from a \$4000 kiln to make pottery at Eisenhower High to \$160 to help a teacher buy art supplies.

In the past 25 years the LPS Foundation has provided over \$800,000 worth of resources to teachers. This past year was tough for LPSF. Many AMBUCS

members are donors to LPSF. It's hard to motivate people to give when you can't meet in person. They couldn't have any events, such as the gala they hold every year. In the last 3 years LPS Foundation has provided over \$100,000 in grants. They have received \$200K-\$300K in requests. This year LPSF received only \$55,000 in requests. Many teachers didn't know what they needed due to pandemic related lock-downs. LPSF gave \$40,000 in grants, but is looking into a large STEM project.

LPSF is starting a new Putt for LPS Students golf tournament. It will be held at the Lawton Country Club on April 5. The format is 4 man scramble, 2 putt max. Cost is \$400 per team, lunch is included. There's a few contests and a chance to win a car for hitting a hole in one on a Par 3 hole. 5 sponsor levels range from \$100 hole sponsor up to a \$10,000 double eagle sponsor.

LPSF is selling a new cookbook. Lisa said it was a difficult and personal project. Her mother was a great cook, but passed away due to COVID-19 just days after the book had gone to print. Copies are available at Liberty National Bank at 4005 W Gore Blvd.

LPSF members are Pillars. It's \$1000 annually for businesses, \$500 for families and \$250 for LPS employees.

Lisa said there are about 250 Pillars. She has a goal to increase those numbers by a large margin.
