### THIS WEEK

The August 30, 2021 club meeting was called to order by Kent Jester. Jeff Sadler led the group in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

### GUEST SPEAKER

Lisa Carson, Executive Director of the Lawton Public Schools Foundation, was our guest speaker this week. Lisa grew up in Lawton, attended its schools and Cameron University. She worked at LPS for 32 years as a teacher, counselor and principal. She retired from LPS to take the director job at LPSF. Lisa says it is a great job.

The LPSF is a 501(c)(3) group. Its goal is to raise as much money as it can to meet the needs of LPS teachers. Teacher grants is the top program at LPSF. This year they have \$100,000 set aside for grants. The pandemic has made the past couple years pretty unusual. The LPSF had \$100K reserved for grants last year, but received only \$30K worth of requests. Many teachers didn't know what the school year would look like, so they didn't turn in requests.

The LPSF does most of its fund raising via two events. One is coming up soon: the breakfast at Golden Corral. In the past Golden Corral has covered all the food and labor costs. The LPSF is



covering food costs this year due to the pandemic's hit on the restaurant. The breakfast will take place September 17 from 6:00am to 9:00pm. Sponsor levels at the breakfast are \$200, \$300 & \$400.

LPSF works to recruit Pillars. They're \$500 per year for individuals or families, \$1000 per year for businesses. 100% of Pillar funding goes to the classroom. Lisa said Lawtonians are generous if they know what they're donating will be spent as intended. Lisa promised she will be a good steward of those funds.

Lisa said if you give your time that's huge. Doing so takes more effort than writing a check. She told us about a military couple who agreed to help a 5th grade class every afternoon with its math classes. LPSF can match people with certain skills up with classes who can utilize them. She asked anyone who wants to serve on the LPSF board to get in touch with her. Our club has several members who have served on the school board or in other ways with LPS.

During Q&A Lisa told us about another LPSF fund-raising effort, their cook books. They're \$30 each. The books contain recipes submitted by residents of Lawton. There are stories inside from teachers telling how LPSF grants have impacted their classes and stories about the recipes. Lisa's late mother gave a

recipe for cinnamon rolls. You can get a cook book by visiting Lisa's office at Liberty National Bank on Gore Blvd.
