Christina Woodson with the Women's Business Summit was the guest speaker. She is working with Lynn Null and Cynthia Sosa for the event that will be held at Great Plains Technology Center's Worley Center on September 15. It will be the second year for the summit, with the last happening in 2019.

The acronym stands for Banker, Accountant, Insurance broker, Lawyer and Organizations. The team will help guide participants through important decisions as they build or grow their business.
