### THIS WEEK

The February 20, 2023 club meeting was called to order by Jenny Clement-Shaw. Gordon Shaw led the group in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.



Michael Cleghorn

Michael Cleghorn, City Manger for the City of Lawton, was the guest speaker. He has served in the position since 2019. His office is responsible for all operations within city government, about 865 employees in all. Cleghorn's position, along with the city attorney, city clerk and municipal judge are appointed by the city council. There are 14 departments within Lawton's city government.

Cleghorn said work is currently underway to prepare for next year's budget. He said the process consists of capital improvements, capital outlay, employee compensation and maintenance and operations. He said the city is currently operating at about three-percent above projections after a 15-percent utility bill increase. Cleghorn said that underscores how inflation has affected the city's ability to pay for new equipment, recruit workers and continue infrastructure improvements.

Cleghorn touted the recent success of economic development initiatives within the city and Comanche County. He also provided updates on major roadway and sidewalk improvements. He said an inspection by a road analysis firm will help determine future construction projects.
