Sergeant Matt Dimmitt with the Lawton Police Department was the guest speaker. He has been on the LPD force for 17 years. He's spent the past five years in the Community Oriented Police (COP) Division. Dimmitt says the division, created by LPD in 1980, allows officers time to meet with families to talk about issues they're facing, organize events and conduct programs to "help build bridges between the community and the police department." He said the best program to help increase communication and cooperation with community members is the Citizens Police Academy (CPA). The next CPA begins in February and runs through April 13. Meetings are held Thursday evenings from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. at Great Plains Technology Center. Dimmitt said the program goes through

every facet of the police department. That includes patrol, criminal investigation, K9 and tactical divisions. Participants also meet with Comanche County District Court Judge Scott Meaders and the Juvenile Bureau to learn about the judicial process when cases are presented to the court.

The CPA will later explore crime scene investigations, interrogations, animal control, lake patrol, dive team, narcotics and Sentinels. Participants will also be able to use the shooting simulator and visit the shooting range.

Dimmitt said another highlight of the CPA is the dispatch center. He said dispatchers take over 140,00 calls each year. He attributes the rise in calls to cell phones and the amount of people who call in to report incidents. More recently, the LPD hostage negotiation and Emergency Response Team have been a focus, due to mass shootings and riots across the country. Applications are being accepted for the next CPA.
