THIS WEEK

The June 13, 2022 club meeting was called to order by 1st Vice President Alan Jolly. Jeff Sadler led the group in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Greg Bynum, Captain of the Trade Practice Unit of the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement (ABLE) Commission, was the guest speaker. He's an Altus native who has worked for the State of Oklahoma for 36 years, including 27 years with ABLE. His presentation focused on the different type of licenses available to non-profit organizations to sell alcohol for fundraising purposes and the regulations that are attached. This includes the club's upcoming beer sales at Freedom Fest.

Bynum told the group that purchasing alcohol in Oklahoma is not a right, but rather a privilege. He wants volunteers to know that it is okay to deny service to potential customers, especially if their age is in doubt. At Freedom Fest, wrist bands will be given to those 21years-old and over, but Bynum says to be on the lookout for people swapping bands. It is not a requirement to request an ID to verify a customer is of legal age, but it is illegal to sell to anyone under 21. Unless volunteers have direct knowledge that a customer is over 21, an ID check is strongly encouraged. State or Federal government IDs, along with passports, are the most trusted. If there are concerns that an ID may be fake, Bynum advised volunteers to ask for additional forms of identification or speak with a Lawton Police officer for verification. When in doubt, volunteers should say "no" and deny the sale.

According to state statute, there is a two-drink limit per customer, per purchase. It is okay for someone to pay for more than two drinks if they're buying for more than one person, but each person can only carry two beverages at a time. Bynum said it's also a good idea to watch to see if drinks are given to somebody who may be underage.

It is illegal for volunteers to drink alcohol while serving alcohol. It's also against the law to "over serve" customers. However, Bynum said it is hard to determine a person's level of impairment without a breathalyzer or blood test. He suggested that volunteers look for physical signs of impairment, including staggered walking and slurred speech. Bynum recommended having one volunteer focused on watching customer behavior at the beer stand and beyond.
