Clarence Fortney

Clarence Fortney, Superintendent of Great Plains Technology Center (GPTC) was the guest speaker. He shared his story of chapter member David Denham's mother hiring him as a welding instructor in 1979.

Fortney is now in his 43rd year at GPTC. His institution is one of 29 across the state of Oklahoma. Each is governed by its own local board of education. That allows Fortney and other leaders to introduce ideas that are best for industrial education in their own communities.

GPTC has 185 employees across two campuses in Lawton and Frederick. Fortney said about half of the current student body are high school students and the remainder adults. He said the school is doing all it can to keep up with the demand for business and industry training for local employers. For example, Fortney said they are working to fulfill the need of Goodyear to train 60 industrial maintenance workers.

GPTC is considered a Gold Star School based on standards that include student placement.
