The March 6, 2023 club meeting was called to order by Jenny Clement-Shaw. Larry Kindt led the group in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.




Tanna Vu

Tanna Vu, chapter member and Director of Community Engagement for United Way of Southwest Oklahoma, was the guest speaker. She said the organization's annual fundraising campaign is winding down. As of last week, 83 percent of the \$1.35 million goal had been raised.

Vu said 19 agencies recently submitted applications for funding for the next fiscal year. She said the Community Investment Committee (CIC), comprised of community members, evaluates each request to help make the determination for funding. Vu said 25 new members will take part in this year's CIC. They will eventually present their recommendations to the United Way of Southwest Oklahoma board of directors for the final decision.

Vu said the need for agency services is higher than it has ever been. Agencies are reporting a large number of first-time recipients. The Lawton Food Bank, for example, is seeing a 70 percent increase in distributions. Vu said there's been a focus this year on determining which parts of Comanche County have the most needs.
