Dan Kite

Great Plains AMBUCS member Dan Kite was the guest speaker. He spoke about his extensive experience in the world of cycling. He has found that recumbent cycles, those that allow riders to sit in a laid-back reclining position, tend to work different muscle groups than upright bikes, including thighs, lower back, legs, hips and abs. Many of the AmTryke models are recumbent, including the tadpole models. They are also tricycles, which allows the riders to have better balance. He has found that if an AmTryke is fitted and adjusted properly, riders can exercise for hours with no pain. For older riders, the type of pedals on their Tryke also plays an important role.

For safety, Kite recommended installing lights on AmTrykes. He said they're inexpensive and provide another layer of protection. The goal is for motorists to be able see cyclists so they can avoid them. The orange
